The morning host and music director for several decades at WEMU, 89.1 FM, Linda has been a fixture at the outdoor tent stage.







It's all prepared by Schoolcraft's Food Service department under the direction of Executive Chef Aaron Cook.

Alcohol Restrictions

Schoolcraft College's alcoholic beverage license limits sale and consumption to the VisTaTech Center only. Beer and wine are available for purchase at the Main Street Café and Henry's Café

and may be consumed in all VisTaTech locations except the Presentation Room. Alcohol may not be consumed outside of the building; this restriction includes the Yellow Tent. Schoolcraft's Campus Police Authority will be enforcing these restrictions.
