New Performers

More than half of today's performers are appearing at the Festival for the first time. This is your chance to become acquainted with the widest range of Michigan's jazz talent and to discover new favorites.

At 9:00 a.m., Dwight Adams is presenting a jazz improvisation clinic, and at 11:00 a.m., Ellie Martin is offering a clinic on jazz vocal improvisation. Both clinics are free and open to the public. Food and Beverages

Food and beverages are available for purchase in three locations. Alcohol Restrictions

Schoolcraft College's alcoholic beverage license limits sale and consumption to the VisTaTech Center only.

Craig Strain

As the president of Michigan Jazz Festival, Craig Strain works closely with an enthusiastic group of fellow volunteers to make the festival a success.


Craig's career in music has spanned a wide variety of genres including education, musicals, brass band, jazz, r&b and classical. He retired from a public education career which included developing one of the strongest secondary education programs in Michigan, as well as teaching at Blue Lake Fine Arts Camp, Oakland Community College, and Macomb Community College. During that time Craig co-led with Curt Neumann the very successful Brookside Jazz Ensemble, and put together professional bands for private events, playing trumpet, flugelhorn, bass and keyboards. Post-teaching, he formed Dr Pocket, a 10-piece horn band, and the Craig Strain Orchestra (CSO), an 18-piece "big band." In addition, he

currently is the arranger and music director for Mirror of Mathis and The Broadway Project.

A prolific arranger/composer, his music has been performed by many organizations including The Count Basie Orchestra, The Phoenix Symphony Orchestra, and others locally and beyond including Japan, Florida, California and Arizona. Now Music Director Emeritus of Motor City Brass Band, his career as MD there led to it becoming one of the finest and most well-known brass bands in the US. His hundreds of brass band arrangements and compositions have been performed by the famous Brass Band of Battle Creek, as well as brass bands in Michigan, Illinois, New York, Pennsylvania, Indiana and Australia.

In addition to holding the position of president of the Michigan Jazz Festival, he is president of Music on Belle Isle Group (MObig) whose mission is to renovate the historic Remick band shell and to bring live music back to the island. This summer is the fourth concert series at Belle Isle's Sunset Point.

Craig currently performs with Dr Pocket, CSO, Mirror of Mathis and The Broadway Project and continues to arrange music for his groups and his clients.

Dave McMurray

Blue Note artist Dave McMurray is a native 107 Detroiter, a graduate of the Cranbrook Schools and Wayne State University. The sax player has worked with a wide range of musicians including BB King, the Stones, Bob Dylan, Iggy Pop, Bonnie Raitt, Herbie Hancock, Kid Rock and many more. His newest album, Grateful Dedication, is a jazz interpretation of compositions by the Grateful Dead. "Any music that I hear – and continue to hear – I can see myself playing it. It could be rock, jazz, R&B, whatever. I look for songs that have magic in them."

Diego Rivera

Born in Ann Arbor and raised in East Lansing, Diego Rivera is a prolific performer, composer and arranger. He has released five critically-acclaimed albums as leader; the latest, Mestizo on Posi-Tone Records, features eight of his compositions. He has written works for various recordings, projects and artists most notably for Jazz at Lincoln Center's "Motor City Jazz" concert, a tribute to the music and musicians of Detroit. Diego has toured with vocalists Kurt Elling and Sophie Milman, and is a member of the Ulysses Owens Jr. Big Band and the Gathering Orchestra. This fall he leaves his faculty position at Michigan State to become Director of Jazz Studies at The University of Texas at Austin, and is performing for us today as part of his farewell tour.

New this year

Jon-Erik Kellso

Trumpeter Jon-Erik Kellso was born in Dearborn and grew up in Allen Park. He performed locally with the big bands of Johnny Trudell and JC Heard, the Wayne State Lab Band and James Dapogny's Chicago Jazz Band. He moved to New York City in 1989 to join Vince Giordano's Nighthawks, the world-renowned 20s- and 30s-style eleven-piece band. He has been leading The EarRegulars at the Ear Inn on Sundays since 2007, and can be seen performing at all the great NYC venues, including Birdland, Mezzrow, and Small's. Jon-Erik is on well over a hundred CDs, most recently his *Sweet Fruits Salty Roots* on the Jazzology label. He can be heard on several television and movie

soundtracks, and can be seen in "Revolutionary Road," "The Marvelous Mrs. Maisel," and "Boardwalk Empire" — for which the Nighthawks won a Grammy. The Michigan Jazz Festival welcomes Jon-Erik home.

Anthony Stanco

Anthony Stanco is a trumpeter, composer, bandleader and educator. He did his undergraduate studies at the Manhattan School of Music and Michigan State University. He was the winner of the International Trumpet Guild's 2013 Jazz Improvisation Competition. He has served on the faculty of the Ohio State University, Board College, and recently Michigan State. His most recent recording is *You Know the Feeling* on the Detroit Music Factory label.

Bill Bolle was a lifetime bassist and lover of traditional jazz music. He passed away in June, 2021, after a brave four-and-a-half-year battle with mesothelioma. At the time of his retirement, he was the longest-seated judge in Oakland County, and 2nd longest in the State of Michigan, with 45 years on the bench. However, he always said that if he had it to do over again, he would have wanted to be a better musician. He and his wife Sally ran the Greater Detroit Jazz Society which is still going strong. He loved his fellow musicians, and took great joy in hiring them and their bands for Jazz at Shield's. He was a member of the Pontiac Federation of Musicians for over 50 years. The Bill Bolle Presentation Stage is named in memory of Bill.




